

Mathematical Development

Place value, ordering and rounding.

- Recognise the place value of each digit in a number.
- Read and write numbers up to 1000 in words and numerals.

- Count in 1s, 10s and 100s from any given number.

Properties of numbers and number sequences.

- Find 10 or 100 more or less than any given number.
- Count in multiples of 2,3,5 and 10.

Addition and Subtraction

- Recall addition facts up to 20.
- Add and subtract numbers mentally.
- Estimate the answer to a calculation and use the inverse operation to check.
- Apply all of these skills to problem solving activities.

Creative Curriculum

Scotland - A geography based topic on the country of Scotland. Looking at map skills, topographical landscapes, rivers, mountains and also the human geography of environmental change, economic activity and trade in Scotland.

Art -Focusing on the work of Rennie Macintosh, the children will create sketches, review, edit and improve their own work.

Music - During music lesson with Mrs Macdonald the children will learn how to play the recorder.

Science

Animals including humans -

identifying what humans need to be healthy, learning about the human digestive process, animal and human skeletons and the purpose of muscles.

Rocks- To learn how rocks are made, to understand different materials have different purposes, to understand how fossils are made, to investigate what soil is made up of.

PSHE

During PSHE lessons the children will be learning about their rights and responsibilities in school and at home, and new beginnings.

Communication, Language and Literacy

A range of different genres will be explored this term to enable the children to utilize all of their literacy skills. We will study myths, explanation texts and fictional writing. Looking at using interesting expanded noun phrases, adventurous vocabulary and adverbs and improving fluency and content of writing.

Grammar and Punctuation: use speech marks and dialogue within a narrative, looking at word classes and exploring their meanings. Effectively using punctuation throughout all written work.

Comprehension: children will develop their inference and deduction skills, become able to identify different text types and be able to answer questions about characters and the author's use of vocabulary.

Spelling: Recap all of the Y2 spelling words. Identify and use suffixes and prefixes effectively, strive to use the correct spelling in all of their written work.

Religious Education



During Religious education the children will be learning all about the Islamic faith. They will explore how Muslims live, the religious festivals they celebrate and their religious customs. The children will then move on to learn about Harvest and how important it is to give thanks.
